#### The Courses



Students will need to attend one course after school. The children can choose from the following topics (this will only need to be finalised later in the year):

The children will also need to complete one project, which will have to be completed by the end of June and can be any of a selection of topics including:

### Completing the Course

#### Graduation

If students successfully complete the degree, they will be invited (with family members) to an award ceremony. This will take place at a university. The children will get to wear a university 'cap and gown' to receive their graduation certificate.
