



The Parish Way:



This week, we have re-launched 'The Parish Way' - all about how we behave and learn when in school.

At Parish we develop children's character and Christian spirit through the 'Parish Way' curriculum. In order to do this, we define the behaviours and habits that we expect pupils to live out. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are polite, respectful, grateful and who put others before themselves – this is how they can show Faith, Hope and Love beyond their Parish years. We believe that as pupils practise these behaviours, over time they become habits that positively shape how they feel about themselves and how other people perceive them.



The curriculum is taught explicitly during the first week in Autumn term. Children should learn the content of the curriculum so that they can recall the information and act upon it. At the start of each subsequent half-term, the 'Parish Way' curriculum is revisited with pupils and will continue to be reinforced throughout the year. We use our Parish Spirit sessions to support the delivery of the Parish Way across the year.

In school, we have revisited our school rules, looked at WOW walking, our behaviour in class and outside and how to show our best manners. Ask your child all about this—they have been amazing!
