



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What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

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Snopchal is on instant messaging opp which allow users to send images, videos and texts for people in their hierds list. One of Snapchat's unique features is that pictures and messages 'disappear' 24 hours after they ve been viewed; however, this content isn't as temporary as many believe – with come users saving screenshots or using another device to take a photo of their screen. This year, shopphat added 'My Aj' a customisable chatbot with which people can chat and shore correts, as well as esking for advice and suggestions of places to visit. WHAT ARE THE RISKS? sereen.

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CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS

Even if your child only connects with people they know, they may still get friend requests from strongers. The Quick Add option lets users befriend Quice Add option left users bettend people the dop recommends – but these 'friends' are merely a username, which could have anyone behind it. Accepting such requests reveals children's personal information through the Story, Snapileop and Spotlight heatures, potentially putting them at risk from predators.

EXCESSIVE USE

Snapchot works hard on user angagement, with foctures like streads (messaging the some person every day to build up o high score). Spotlight challes inspen tempt users into spending time producing content in search of cosh prizes and online forms, while it's acry for children to poss hours weatching Spotlight's endless scool of videos.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some videos and posts on Snapchat aren't suitable for children. The hashitoga used to group content are determined by the poster, so aren an innocent search term could still yield age inappropriote result. The app's 'disappearing messages' feature also makes it easy for young people (terms in particular) to mere emiliati messages and an an explicit images on impulse – a sexting continues to be a risk associated with Snapchat. 10

There have alweady been numerous reports al young users turning to Al for medical resp and diagnoses, which could be inaccurate and therefore potentially dangerous.



APPLYING FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2024

If your child turns 4 between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024, he or she will transfer to primary school in September 2024. From Wednesday 27th September the website <u>www.sthelens.gov.uk/admissions</u> is open for parents who wish to apply online. You will be notified on 16 April 2024 confirming your child's school place.

The closing date for you to submit your application is 15 January 2024.

APPLYING FOR A SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2024

If your child turns 11 between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024, he or she will transfer to secondary school in September 2024. From Wednesday 27th September the website <u>www.sthelens.gov.uk/admissions</u> is open for parents who wish to apply online. You will be notified on 1 March 2024 confirming your child's school place.

The closing date for you to submit your application is 31 October 2023.

HALLOWEEN SAFETYTIPS



Costumes should be lightcoloured and flame resistant with reflective strips so that children are more easily seen at night. (And remember to put reflective tape on bikes, skateboards, and brooms, too!).



Remind children to keep away from open fires and candles. (Costumes can be extremely flammable.)`



Remind children to walk, slither, and sneak on sidewalks - not in the street.



Provide yourself or the children with a flashlight to see better and to be better seen.



Have children plan their route and share it with you and the family.



Remind children to look both ways before crossing the street to check for cars, trucks, and low-flying brooms.



Make sure children know they should accept treats at the door and must not get into cars or enter the homes or apartments of strangers.



Trick or Treaters should travel in groups of four or five. Young children should be accompanied by an adult.



Explain to children that calls should be made along one side of the street first and then the other, and that it's best to cross the street only at intersections or crosswalks. Set agreed-to boundaries with your children. Explain the importance of staying within them and arriving home on time.

STAY SAFE THIS BONFIRE DIGHT DO'S DONT'S

POSITION THE BONFIRE well away from houses, garages, sheds, fences, overhead cables, trees and shrubs -15m is usually a safe distance.

Make sure the **BONFIRE IS STABLE** and will not collapse.

Ensure everyone is a **SAFE DISTANCE AWAY** (15m) from the fire and children are supervised at all times.

Keep **BUCKETS OF WATER**, a garden hose or a fire extinguisher nearby in case of an emergency.

POUR WATER on the remains of the bonfire before leaving.

KEEP PETS INDOORS during bonfire night.

DO NOT burn the following: Tyres, Cylinders, Canisters, Aerosols Paints, Plastics, Rubber & Foam filled furniture.

NEVER use flammable liquids to light a bonfire.

NEVER light or store fireworks near a bonfire.

NEVER leave a bonfire unattended.

If you intend to have a bonfire, please contact the Fire Service on 01268 909404 and give the following information:

Date, Time and Location of the bonfire Name of responsible person and contact telephone number. How you intend to extinguish the fire after the event or if it gets out of control.
