


Attendance Update



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

TikTok is a free social media platform that lets users create, share and watch short videos ranging anywhere from 15 seconds to 10 minutes in duration. The app gained notoriety for its viral dances, trends and celebrity cameos and can be a creative, fun platform for teens to enjoy. Now available in 75 languages, it has more than a billion active users worldwide (as of spring 2022) and is most popular with the under-16 age bracket. In fact, a 2022 Ofcom report found TikTok to be the most-used social media platform for posting content, particularly among young people aged 12 to 17.

APPLYING FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOL PACE FOR SEPTEMEBER 2024

If your chid turns 4 between 1 September 2023 and 31 August 2024, he or she will transfer to primary school in September 2024. The website <u>www.sthelens.gov.uk/admissions</u> is open for parents to apply online. You will be notified on 16th April 2024 confirming your child's place.

The closing date for applications is 15th January 2024

Ring the school office as soon as possible to explain any absence.

Anti Bullying Week/Odd Socks Day

The theme of Make A Noise About Bullying came about following consultation with teachers and pupils by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which coordinates Anti-Bullying Week every year in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. The week also kicks off on Monday 13th November with Odd Sock Day!

The idea is to wear odd socks to school or work to highlight that we are all unique and to spread kindness on the first day of Anti-Bullying Week.

If your child has an SEN or significant worries and is due to transition to secondary school in September 2024, we would love you to join us on our online sessions to share preparation tips and advice.

By 31st October 2023 you will have submitted a secondary school application to name your 3 preferred schools.

We are delighted to offer you some advice and support to be able to effectively plan the next steps of your child's journey.

Many of the strategies will work for most children who require that little bit of additional support.

FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS

WARWICKSHIRE

HERE ARE OUR TOP TEN TIPS TO KEEPING YOUR CHILDREN SAFE THIS BONFIRE NIGHT.

DON'T BUILD A Bonfire too high

ALWAYS ENSURE YOUR FIRE IS BUILT IN AN OPEN Space and not too close to houses, hedges, fences or sheds. Where possible, try to attend an organised display and keep a safe distance to ensure your safety.



VEVER LIGHT A Bonfire with Petrol

OR ANY FLAMMABLE LIQUID, INSTEAD USE Domestic fire lighters and never throw Aerosol cans or tyres onto a fire

KEEP A BUCKET OF Water Nearby

ENSURE YOU HAVE A HOSEPIPE OR BUCKET OF WATER ON HAND IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY. USED FIREWORKS AND SPARKLERS SHOULD ALWAYS BE PLACED INTO THE BUCKET AFTER USE FOR SAFETY.



LWAYS FOLLOW

AND REMEMBER TO USE A TORCH AND NOT THE LIGHT OF A FLAME TO READ THE INSTRUCTIONS ON EACH FIREWORK. BE SURE TO USE A TAPER TO LIGHT THE FIREWORK AT ARM'S LENGTH AND STAND WELL BACK FROM THEM. ALWAYS SUPERVISE YOUNG CHILDREN AROUND FIREWORKS. MARKED WITH THE BS7114 KITEMARK

ONLY BUY

YOU SHOULD ALSO NEVER PLACE FIREWORKS In your pocket. Be sure to store them in A cool, dry box.
