Anti-Bullying Charter



WHAT IS BULLYING?



Parish children define bullying as;

“Bullying is when somebody hurts you or your feelings several times on purpose. It can make you feel powerless, helpless and weak. We know it can happen in many places.”

BULLYING IS NOT

A one-off fight, an argument with a friend, a spur of the moment threat or a spiteful comment.

SCHOOL PROCEDURE

Class teacher will speak to the child privately and investigate if found to be bullying.

Class teacher will inform the key staff and pass on a copy of the report.

Head teacher or Deputy Head teacher will investigate if there is a recurrence.

CYBER BULLYING



Children are not allowed a mobile phone in school.

Children do not access the internet unsupervised.

Children can use the **CEOP** button on the School Webpage page to report bullying.

DO

Do tell someone, either a teacher, adult or a friend

Do try and tell the bully to stop

Do use the 'worry box'

DON'T

Don't ignore it

Don't copy the behaviour of a bully

Don't do it back to them

Don't join in with bullying behaviour
