If yes, then please come to our Eat & Meet event at the Lucem Community Cinema on Monday 17th June 12-1.30pm


We will show you our film about the work Cafe Laziz does and the people we work with, followed by lunch and a Q&A, plus a chance to meet the real people behind the headlines.

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School Uniform Reminders

Please see below a few reminders about our school uniform.

Our Uniform

The uniform is as follows:

- Grey v-necked jumper, grey tank top or grey cardigan (with or without the school logo).
- White polo shirt
- White shirt with green tie (KS2 only)
- Black trousers/Black Shorts.
- Black skirt/pinafore (in summer, a green and white summer dress may be worn).
- Black, sensible shoes (not trainers)
- Grey, black or white socks (green frill permitted)
- Grey or black tights.
- Green book bag (with or without the school logo)

Trainers, open-toed sandals and large, thick boots are not considered suitable footwear for school.

<u>Sensible, plain black shoes must be worn by both bays and girls.</u>

Our PE Kit

Children are asked to come into school on the day of their PE lesson wearing their PE kit. They can wear it for the full school day.

Parents/carers are responsible for ensuring their child is dressed appropriately for PE.

The PE kit is as follows:

<u>Plain white T-shirt (with or without the school logo)</u>

- Black zipped hoody or sweatshirt or normal school jumper (with or without school logo)
- Black tracksuit bottoms or leggings.
- Black shorts (in summer)
- <u>Plain, suitable trainers or black pumps</u>

Jewellery

The only permitted jewellery that may be worn is:

- One pair of stud consings (no other piercings are permitted)
- A sensible wristwatch (not a smartwatch)

School Bog

Pupils must use an appropriately sized green book bag. These can be with or without the school logo.

Large bags / large rucksacks are not permitted
