


Vehicle Text A: When We Walked on The Moon

lunar module	A small craft used for travelling between the moon's surface and an orbiting spacecraft. <i>spacecraft</i>
rock-strewn	Covered with a scattering of rocks <i>rocky covered</i>

moonquakes	A tremor of the moon's surface <i>shake rumble</i>

mission control	The people and equipment responsible for directing a journey in space <i>tracking guidance</i>


Writer's Knowledge

- Think about using verb prefixes to change the meaning of a word.
- Think about using a modal verb to show how the character is feeling and what they are thinking.
- Think about using a dash for parenthesis—to add further information.
- Think about using a comma to mark where the fronted adverbial ends and the main clause starts.
- Think about using expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information clearly.
- Think about using inverted commas to show direct speech.
- Think about using longer and shorter sentences for impact and cohesion (flow).
- Think about figurative language to add detail to descriptions e.g. simile and metaphor


