The core concept of creation is found throughout the Old Testament of the Bible.

God made our wonderful world so we should look after it.	Humans should care for the world because it belongs to God.	To be close to God, Christians may worship and ask for forgiveness if they do something wrong.	There is some controversy of creation in Genesis and more modern scientific accounts.
