
Spelling



Our Curriculum Intent:

At Parish Church of England Primary School, our English curriculum is designed to provide a consistent, sequenced approach that immerses pupils in rich language and high-quality literature. Through carefully selected texts and a curriculum informed by the Ready Steady Write, Read, and Spell schemes, children are given meaningful opportunities to read and write across a range of genres and for real audiences. Our focus on a text-led curriculum nurtures creativity, purpose, and confidence, enabling pupils to become fluent writers who write to inform, persuade, and entertain. From early phonics through Read Write Inc., to discrete reading and spelling instruction in KS2, our provision ensures progression, enjoyment, and a deep understanding of the written word - with a clear consideration to all pupils securing strong foundational knowledge.

At Parish Primary School, we believe that all our children can become fluent, confident and competent spellers. We encourage our pupils to think and write creatively, be adventurous with their use of language and to write with clear purpose and for pleasure. In order for these aims to be realised, it is essential that our pupils learn the knowledge and skills to spell accurately. We want our pupils to be equipped with the knowledge and range of strategies for learning spelling and to be able to apply their strategies when spelling words in their writing. To ensure this happens we teach using Ready Steady Spell. This is a systematic spelling programme which covers all the National Curriculum objectives in a cyclical way.





Evidence of learning:

Evidencing learning during Ready Steady Spell lessons involves regularly assessing children's understanding through spelling tests, written activities, and verbal feedback. Children record their written outcomes in a pupil booklet, providing a clear record of their progress. This ongoing assessment helps identify areas needing reinforcement, inform future teaching, and celebrate successes. Additionally, children are encouraged to apply spelling rules and strategies when writing across the curriculum, reinforcing their skills in a variety of subjects and real-life contexts.



Curriculum Progression:

Ready Steady Spell is a systematic, evidence-based spelling scheme designed for Key Stage 1 and 2 (Years 2-6) that aligns with the Writing Framework and supports a consistent whole-school approach. Building on phonics knowledge, it engages children and ensures long-term progress through a cyclical curriculum that revisits key spelling patterns regularly to embed learning. Lessons follow a clear four-step routine: Revisit & Review, Teach, Practise & Apply. Children are introduced to seven practical strategies—such as Syll-a-beat and Rule Rhyme—to help them find the most effective way to remember spellings. Spellings are carefully linked to National Curriculum content, helping children apply and reinforce spelling knowledge across subjects. The lessons are inclusive, supporting all learners, including those with additional needs or English as an additional language, and are backed by extensive teacher training (including through Literacy Counts) to ensure confident and consistent delivery.


The Teaching of Spelling

KSI Implementation

In Key Stage 1 (Year 2), Ready Steady Spell builds on children's strong phonics foundations once they are ready, gradually introducing spelling rules and patterns. The programme uses a clear, step-by-step routine where each week focuses on a specific spelling concept, supported by multisensory activities like songs, rhymes and games to help children understand and remember the rules. Daily sessions include guided practice, word sorting and spelling tasks that increase in complexity over time. Children apply their spelling in writing activities to reinforce learning, while regular review and dictation consolidate skills, ensuring steady progress throughout the year.










KS2 Implementation

In Key Stage 2 (Year 3-6), Ready Steady Spell builds on and extends children's existing spelling knowledge. The programme follows a structured weekly routine that introduces more advanced spelling rules and patterns. Lessons include focused teaching of spelling strategies, multisensory activities and word investigations to deepen understanding. Children engage in guided practice, spelling challenges and are provided with opportunities to apply their learning in writing tasks across the curriculum. Regular review, dictation and quizzes help consolidate skills and track progress. This approach ensures continued development of spelling accuracy, vocabulary and confidence throughout Key Stage 2.

Our Rainbow Promises In Spelling

Resilience and Perseverance:

Teaching spelling helps build resilience and perseverance by encouraging children to keep trying, learn from mistakes and improve through consistent effort. As they tackle challenging words and patterns, children develop a growth mindset, understanding that progress comes with practice. This supports not only their literacy skills but also their confidence and determination in learning more broadly.

Articulate Learner:

Teaching spelling supports children in becoming articulate learners by improving their ability to recognise, understand and use words accurately. Mastery of spelling helps children communicate their ideas clearly and confidently in both writing and speaking. It strengthens vocabulary development, reinforces word patterns and deepens their understanding of language structure. This foundation enables children to express themselves precisely, enhancing their overall literacy and communication skills, which are essential for becoming articulate learners.

Influence Aspirations:

Teaching spelling can positively influence children's aspirations by building their confidence and sense of achievement. As children improve their spelling skills, they feel more capable and motivated to tackle challenges across subjects. This success fosters a growth mindset, encouraging them to set higher goals and believe in their ability to learn and succeed. Strong literacy skills also open more opportunities for future education and careers, helping children to aspire to and envision a wider range of possibilities.

nurture Curiosity:

Teaching spelling nurtures children's curiosity by encouraging them to explore word patterns, rule rhymes and language rules. It invites them to discover how words are formed and connected, including the etymology and origins of words. This hands—on exploration makes learning engaging and sparks a deeper interest in language, inspiring children to ask questions and uncover new meanings.

British and Christian Values:

Teaching spelling supports British and Christian values by encouraging respect, responsibility and perseverance. It promotes hard work, integrity and kindness through collaborative learning. Developing clear communication also fosters honesty and understanding, helping children express themselves thoughtfully.

Opportunities to Build on Knowledge and Skills:

The teaching of spelling builds on previous learning by regularly revisiting and reinforcing spelling rules and patterns. Its structured routine connects new words and concepts to prior knowledge, helping consolidate skills over time. Additionally, spelling is practiced across the curriculum, allowing children to apply and deepen their understanding in different subjects, which promotes steady progress and greater confidence.

Wellbeing and Health:

Teaching spelling supports good wellbeing and health by building children's confidence and sense of achievement, which boosts self-esteem and promotes positive mental wellbeing. The structured routines and clear goals reduce anxiety around learning, creating a positive and supportive environment. Encouraging perseverance through challenges helps develop resilience and emotional strength. Additionally, engaging, multisensory spelling activities foster enjoyment of learning.

At Parish, staff CPD for Ready Steady Spell is a key priority to ensure high-quality teaching of spelling and to embed strong foundational literacy practices as part of a wider, whole-school approach to literacy. To support this, Literacy Counts has been in to school to deliver up-to-date training, equipping staff with the latest strategies and resources aligned with the Ready Steady Spell programme. In addition, regular coaching cycles are embedded into our CPD approach, allowing teachers to reflect on practice, implement new techniques and receive constructive feedback. Staff are also supported by the English Lead through model lessons, team teaching and planning support, ensuring consistent delivery and building confidence in teaching spelling within the broader context of developing literacy across the curriculum.

Staff CPD

Ready Steady Spell is a structured and inclusive spelling programme designed to support all learners. It follows a consistent weekly routine that includes the introduction of spelling rules, engaging practice activities, dictation and opportunities to apply learning in writing. This predictable structure helps build confidence and supports children with a range of learning needs, including those with SEND and EAL. The programme uses multisensory approaches to suit different learning styles and offers differentiated word lists to ensure appropriate challenge and support for every child. Regular, low-stakes assessments help track progress and inform teaching. By linking spelling to real writing contexts, Ready Steady Spell supports children to develop lasting skills in a meaningful way.

Strong Foundations

Spelling is crucial for strong foundations in literacy and cognitive development because it strengthens connections between brain areas involved in thinking, memory, and motor skills. It also improves fine motor skills, essential for other daily tasks and academic pursuits.

We ensure that our children have enough teaching and practice for them to become fluent in foundational knowledge and skills, such as in handwriting and composing simple sentences and complex tasks are not introduced too soon.
