Antony Gormley is a British artist from London.


Antony Gormley's main type of art is sculpture.

Anthony Gormley's sculptures are mainly based on the human body.

To make the sculptures, Antony Gormley wraps parts of himself in cling-film (avoiding his face) and then covers this in clay to make a mould.

Antony Gormley uses materials such as concrete, iron, copper, steel and clay.

'Field for the British Isles' were made by volunteers in St Helens and they were hand-sized, their eyes were to be deep and closed and the head was to be in proportion with the body.
